
- Coherence

China

Mainly bilateral engagement

- Not member of OECD, agencies not members of ICN
- US MoUs and cooperation
- EU-China Trade Project
- Regional BRICs

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- MoUs with SAIC and NDRC. MofCom pending
- Co-sponsorship of China Antimonopoly Forum with UK FCO
- (planned) training seminars with MofCom on mergers
- Potential Secondees
- Best practice, advocacy, capacity building rather than case cooperation
- Interests in process/ agency efficiencies/advocacy

India

- Multilateral and bilateral engagement
 - ICN, UNCTAD, BRICs
 - US, EU

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- Initial relationship building with CCI
- Scope for outcome-oriented secondments and training
- Building on the experience of other agencies

Some dos and don'ts

- Avoid preaching
 - Be aware of our own imperfections
- Institutional and cultural context important
 - Competition regime is wider than the agency
- Good advocacy can be crucial for a new regime
- Importance of transparent decisions and processes
- Build peer to peer to relations
- Coordinate bilateral efforts use multilateral
