LIDC Questions Workshop: 30 May 2018 at 5.30pm

Each year the LIDC examines two topical questions concerning competition law and IP/unfair competition law. The two questions are then the focus of discussions at the annual LIDC Congress with a view to adopting resolutions in the areas concerned.

This year the competition law question relates to breaches of competition law and which rules should govern the attribution of civil and criminal liability. The IP question explores how the holder of intellectual property rights can protect its brand in the context of on and off-line distribution and after-sales service and whether the existing framework for such protection strikes a fair balance between stakeholders. Further details of the two questions that are to be discussed at the forthcoming LIDC Congress in Budapest, between 4-7 October 2018, are set out below.

We are delighted to announce that Richard Jenkinson, DLA Piper (competition law) and Collette Rawnsley, Wiggin LLP (IP) have each agreed to act as UK National Rapporteurs on this year's questions.

Please note: this event has now been rescheduled. We shall now be holding the evening workshop on **Wednesday 30 May at Wiggin LLP, 9th Floor, Met Building, 22 Percy Street, London W1T 2BU** to seek Members' contributions and comments on the draft UK reports prepared by our National Rapporteurs. The working session will begin at **5.30pm** and will last for up to two hours. The Workshop is informal and refreshments will be on offer to lubricate discussions.

There is no additional charge for attendance at the workshop for members. However, there is a charge for non-members: £50, or £35 (full time academic/public sector employees), or £10 (students, trainees, pupil barristers). Registrations can be completed and paid for on-line.
