Omblin Ancelin, David Mamane and Noel Watson-Doig, moderated by Pranvera Këllezi have kindly agreed to speak on the following subject:

"E-Commerce/Geo-blocking in UK, France and Switzerland"

Omblin Ancelin heads the Competition practice in the Paris Office of Simmons & Simmons.
